A NEW PAIR OF SHOES

Shortly following Christmas, a teenage resident came to live at the Home named Ben*. As is typical with many children we serve, he arrived with nothing besides the clothes on his back. Because of this, all children receive a welcome basket uniquely put together for them. Ben's welcome basket included various treats and comfort items along with pajamas, a change of clothes and toiletries that he needed.

Ben showed great appreciation for each item in his basket, and he proudly displayed the basket on his bedside table in his new room. He shared that Christmas had been slim for him with very few gifts, making these items all the more meaningful to him.

Ben was scheduled to begin school later in that week, so our staff took him shopping to make sure he had everything he needed for his first day in his new school. Throughout the trip, he thanked the staff again and again as they found a coat, several outfits and school supplies for him.

Towards the end of the outing, Ben made a very soft spoken request for a particular pair of shoes. He'd wanted the shoes for a long time and had not had the opportunity to get them. They'd even been an item on his Christmas list, but it hadn't worked out.

Expecting his request to be one for an expensive pair of shoes, the staff member patiently explained the Home's resources to provide for every child are budgeted and stressed the importance of stewarding these resources to make sure each child receives the items they need. Ben

nodded with understanding and said he would be willing to work to pay the difference if needed. Determined to figure out a solution, the staff member went with Ben to look at the shoes.

They arrived at the store and Ben found the shoes immediately. The staff member looked at the price - \$10. Again, Ben offered to pay for the shoes once he earned some money, but the staff member assured him they were well within the budget.

He left the store, thrilled, with the shoes on his feet. He told everyone how comfortable they were and how much he liked them. He has since received an additional pair of shoes, but he still wears his favorite pair often and talks about how much they mean to him.

who did a great job organizing the work around the activities of the staff team and children. Can you imagine trying to keep approximately 35 children from running their fingers through wet paint on walls and doors for two – three weeks? That in itself was a huge accomplishment!

year; a fresh start in a fresh year. It also provides the perfect context for the children we serve because the Children's Attention Home is about providing fresh starts. Sometimes that fresh start is for the parents who need to focus on getting back on their feet in order to best care for their children. Sometimes it is for the healing that needs to happen so the children can return to a safer, more secure environment. And sometimes the fresh start is with a new family to love and care for a

child in a nurturing, healthy environment.

For those of us who are privileged to serve these children on a daily basis, we get to see fresh starts almost every day. We see them experience activities they've never experienced before, grow developmentally,

- Educate yourself and be part of the solution



VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: F3 FORT MILL

The Children's Attention Home partners with a variety of clubs, groups, churches, and businesses that provide ongoing support for our Recreation Program. F3 is one of those groups and we are happy to be approaching our two year anniversary!

F3 is a group of men that come together regularly to participate in fitness related activities like running, boot camps and kettle bell work outs. F3 stands for Fitness, Fellowship and Faith. The 3rd F is heavily emphasized where the group focuses on others in need and these three Fs come together with the purpose of invigorating male leadership in local communities.

F3 has been involved with the Home since April of 2014. Their first mission was a cereal drive in which the group collected over 370 boxes of cereal! The group hosted two other family friendly events and this past year decided to further their commitment and host a variety of activities every other week that has included bike rides, kick ball, capture the flag and a variety of other games.

The following is a note from the group leader, Brian Brenner...

Each time we visit the home we have a routine that starts with a circle where we warm up with 3-5 exercises, then we do our main event like kick-ball or other games then we always finish with the circle of trust that includes a prayer. One of my favorite moments which was the 2nd or 3rd time we volunteered was when one of the children offered to take us out in prayer and she prayed over all the men and their families as well as for the children of the home. It was amazing and something I will never forget; such an honor it was to be prayed for by her.

I enjoy the opportunity to see the children engaging, gaining confidence and being a part of a healing process in their lives even if it is just for a short time every other week. I also see these children impacting the men that participate as well as their broader families as we learn to serve those in need in our community. I also believe that F3, since we are a group of men, are helping these children create a level of trust and give them a sense of confidence with a male figure where that trust may have otherwise been damaged in their lives. They truly give me so much more than I give them and I'm grateful for being a part of such a special group.
