During the summer, we are able to send 12 of our children to tutoring to prepare for next year. With many of our children behind academically, they are taking full advantage of the opportunity to catch up and in some cases get ahead!

Part of our children's summer includes summer camps and jobs through Urban League. We have children traveling locally and as far as Charleston to 14 different camps, and our youth serving in Urban League are helping everywhere from salons to the Boys & Girls club to get valuable job skill training and experience. At the end of the summer, we take the children on a trip to Myrtle Beach. For many this will be the first time they have ever seen the ocean!


